WHY- School systems exist for one reason and one reason only: to improve student outcomes

WHAT- A research based framework that guides school boards to deepen their focus on student outcomes*

HOW- Focuses on key areas of school board behavior change that are presented through an implementation instrument. The most successful school boards are guided through implementation by a certified coach after attending a two-day orientation workshop.

How School Boards Initiate the Framework

- Attend a 2-day workshop with the full governing team
- Agree as a board to pursue a student outcomes focused journey by adopting an implementation timeline.
- Receive implementation support from a certified coach.
- Embrace the journey to creating conditions for improved student outcomes.

What LSG Implementation Looks Like

- Two-year commitment to achieve 80% on your quarterly self-evaluation;
- Adopt student outcome goals and superintendent constraints;
- Spend 50% of time in board authorized public meetings focused on student outcomes;
- Streamline systems and processes to focus on board work.
