



Over thepast 5 years, the district's average ACT composites core and subject area scores English, math, reading, and science increased for all student groups, except for Asiatudent scores reading and math. Although the average ACT reading and math scores for Asian students lecreased during this period, their average score exceeded that of most other dent groups. In comparison with year, African American and Hispanic students hand creased average scores in all fesubject areas in 2014. While Ascrores increased over the years for most student groups, achievement groups remained because Asian and White students consistently scored higher thandid other student groups (Figures Brough 11).
