2011-2012 AISD Student Climate Survey ALC High School

Research indicates that school climate can either be a positive influence on students' learning environment, or can serve as a significant barrier to students' learning. Indeed, students attending high performing, higher economically disadvantaged schools reported higher ratings of behavioral environment, academic self-confidence, teacher expectations for student learning, and student engagement in 2010-2011 than did their peers at lower performing similar schools. Similarly, students attending high performing, less economically disadvantaged schools reported higher ratings of behavioral environment than did their peers at lower performing similar schools in 2010-2011.*

The following tables show the total number of surveys students at ALC returned in 2011-2012 (Table 1), the response rate by grade (Table 2), and the distribution of responses by race/ethnicity compared with the population (Table 3) for students at ALC.




Figure 1. Student Climate Survey Subscales for ALC and all High Schools, 2011-2012

Student Climate Survey was for adult fairness and fespect, which assesses the way teachers and other adults at your campus treat students. Research suggests that high levels of adult fairness and respect contribute to academic achievement. We encourage you to consider the ways your campus supports a respectful environment and share your best practices with others.

ALC's lowest score on the 2011-2012 Student Climate Survey was for student engagement. This subscale measures the extent to which students enjoy their schoolwork and learning. We encourage
