New Federal Standards for Collecting and Reporting Ethnicity and Race

Starting in 201@011, districts were required to report race and ethnicity using revised standards. The new standards require a person to first select his/her ethnicity (Hispanic/Latino or non Hispanic/Latino) and one or more of five race values. Since more than one race value may be chosen, percentages might not add to 100.

Note. Students' grade and ethnicity were selfeported. Population data reflect emollment as of the October 2011 PEIMS snapshot date.
