

2016-2017 COORDINATED SCHOOL HEALTH DISTRICT SUMMARY REPORT

Results

Coordinated School Health (CSH) Program implementation data were collected from each Austin Independent School District (AISD) campus in Spring 2017. Campus results are reflected in the District's strategic scorecard and the House Bill 5 ratings, i.e., the School District Evaluation of Performance in Community and Student Engagement for wellness and physical education (TEC §46 (C) 39.0545).

Schools were rated on their Coordinated School Health Implementation on a 4 point scale (Unacceptable, Acceptable, Recognized, or Exemplary) based on identified activities that support coordinated school health efforts. The rating scale was different at each level¹, based on the overall number of required and supplemental activities available at each level.

¹ High School rating scale: unacceptable – achieved less than the 12 required items; acceptable – achieved all 12 required and 17 or fewer supplemental items; recognized – achieved all 12 required and 18-32 supplemental items; exemplary – achieved all 12 required and 33 or more supplemental items.

Middle school rating scale: unacceptable – achieved less than the 18 required items; acceptable – achieved all 18 required and 19 or fewer supplemental items; recognized – achieved all 18 required and 20-37 supplemental items; exemplary – achieved all 18 required and 38 or more supplemental items.
